

Dangerous Goods Regulations

PROVISIONS FOR DANGEROUS GOODS CARRIED BY PASSENGERS OR CREW

Dangerous goods must not be carried in or as passengers or crew, checked or carry-on baggage, except as otherwise provided below. Dangerous goods permitted in carry-on baggage are also permitted "on one's person", except where specified otherwise.

ELECTRO SHOCK WEAPONS (e.g. Tasers) containing dangerous goods such as explosives, compressed gases, lithium batteries, etc. are forbidden in carry-on baggage or checked baggage or on the person.	✗ FORBIDDEN	
ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES When in retail packagings, containing more than 24% but not more than 70% alcohol by volume, in receptacles not exceeding 5 L, with a total net quantity per person of 5 L.	✓ YES	✓ YES
AMMUNITION, SECURELY PACKAGED In quantities not exceeding 5 kg gross weight per person for that person's own use. Allowances for more than one person must not be combined into one or more packages.	✓ YES	✗ NO
AVALANCHE RESCUE BACKPACK One (1) per person, containing cartridges of compressed gas in Div. 2.2. May also be equipped with a pyrotechnic trigger mechanism containing no more than 200 mg net of Div. 1.4S. The backpack must be packed in such a manner that it cannot be accidentally activated. The airbags within the backpacks must be fitted with pressure relief valves.	✓ YES	✓ YES
BAGGAGE WITH INSTALLED LITHIUM BATTERIES Non-removable batteries exceeding 0,3g lithium metal or 2,7 Wh.	✗ FORBIDDEN

Batteries must contain no more than 0,3g lithium metal or for lithium ion must not exceed 2,7 Wh. • Removable batteries. Batteries must be removed if baggage is to be checked in. 	PERMITTED IN OR AS CHECKED BAGGAGE	PERMITTED IN OR AS CARRY-ON BAGGAGE
<p>BATTERIES, SPARE/LOOSE Including lithium batteries, non-spillable batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries and dry batteries for portable electronic devices must be carried in carry-on baggage only. Articles which have the primary purpose as a power source, e.g. power banks are considered as spare batteries. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lithium metal batteries: the lithium metal content must not exceed 2 g. • Lithium ion batteries: the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 100 Wh. On flights operated by Iberia, unless approved by the company, there is a maximum limit per person of 4 spare lithium batteries with a maximum of 100 Wh. • Non-spillable batteries: must be 12 V or less and 100 Wh or less. Each person is limited to a maximum of 2 spare batteries. 	✗ NO	✓ YES
<p>CAMPING STOVES AND FUEL CONTAINERS THAT HAVE CONTAINED A FLAMMABLE LIQUID, with empty fuel tank and/or fuel container.</p>	✓ YES	✗ NO
<p>CHEMICAL AGENT MONITORING EQUIPMENT When carried by staff members of the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons on official travel.</p>	✓ YES	✓ YES
<p>DISABLING DEVICES Such as mace, pepper spray, etc. containing an irritant or incapacitating substance are forbidden on the person, in checked and carry-on baggage.</p>	✗ FORBIDDEN	
<p>DRY ICE (CARBON DIOXIDE, SOLID) In quantities not exceeding 2.5 kg per person when used to pack perishables not subject to these Regulations in checked or carry-on baggage, provided the baggage (package) permits the release of carbon dioxide gas. Checked baggage must be marked "dry ice" or "carbon dioxide, solid" and with the net weight of dry ice or an indication that there is 2.5 kg or less dry ice.</p>	✓ YES	✓ YES
<p>E-CIGARETTES (Including e-cigars, e-pipes, other personal vaporizers) containing batteries must be individually protected to prevent accidental activation</p>	✗ NO	✓ YES

GAS CARTRIDGES, SMALL, NON-FLAMMABLE Containing carbon dioxide or other suitable gas in Division 2.2. Up to two (2) small cartridges fitted into a self-inflating personal safety device, intended to be worn by a person, such as a life jacket or vest. Not more than two (2) devices per passenger and up to two (2) spare small cartridges per device, not more than four (4) cartridges up to 50 mL water capacity for other devices	✓ YES	✓ YES
GAS CYLINDERS, NON-FLAMMABLE, NON-TOXIC Worn for the operation of mechanical limbs. Also, spare cylinders of a similar size if required to ensure an adequate supply for the duration of the journey.	✓ YES	✓ YES
HAIR STYLING EQUIPMENT CONTAINING A HYDROCARBON GAS CARTRIDGE Up to one per passenger or crew member, provided that the safety cover is securely fitted over the heating element. These curlers must not be used on board the aircraft at any time. Gas refills for such curlers are not permitted in checked or carry-on baggage.	✓ YES	✓ YES
INSULATED PACKAGINGS CONTAINING REFRIGERATED LIQUID NITROGEN (dry shipper), fully absorbed in a porous material containing only non-dangerous goods.	✓ YES	✓ YES
INTERNAL COMBUSTION OR FUEL CELL ENGINES must meet A70.	✓ ON ONE'S PERSON	
LITHIUM BATTERIES: PORTABLE ELECTRONIC DEVICES (PED) CONTAINING LITHIUM METAL OR LITHIUM ION CELLS OR BATTERIES Including medical devices such as portable oxygen concentrators (POC) and consumer electronics such as cameras, mobile phones, laptops and tablets (see 2.3.5.8). For lithium metal batteries the lithium metal content must not exceed 2 g and for lithium ion batteries the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 100 Wh. Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage. Each person is limited to a maximum of 15 PED. *The operator may approve the carriage of more than 15 PED.	✓ YES	✗ NO

<p>LITHIUM BATTERY-POWERED ELECTRONIC DEVICES Lithium ion batteries for portable (including medical) electronic devices, a Wh rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh. For portable medical electronic devices only, lithium metal batteries with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g. Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage.</p>	✓ YES	✓ YES
<p>LITHIUM BATTERIES, SPARE/LOOSE With a Watt-hour rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh for consumer electronic devices and PMED or with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g for PMED only. Maximum of two spare batteries in carry-on baggage only. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.</p>	✗ NO	✓ YES
<p>MATCHES, SAFETY (ONE SMALL PACKET) OR A SMALL CIGARETTE LIGHTER that does not contain unabsorbed liquid fuel, other than liquefied gas, intended for use by an individual when carried on the person. Lighter fuel and lighter refills are not permitted on one's person or in checked or carry-on baggage.</p> <p>NOTE: "Strike anywhere" matches, "Blue flame" or "Cigar" lighters or lighters powered by a lithium battery without a safety cap or means of protection against unintentional activation are forbidden.</p>	✓ ON ONE'S PERSON	
<p>MOBILITY AIDS Battery-powered wheelchairs or other similar mobility devices with non-spillable wet batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries or dry batteries.</p>	✓ YES	✗ NO
<p>MOBILITY AIDS Battery-powered wheelchairs or other similar mobility devices with spillable batteries or with lithium ion batteries.</p>	✓ YES	✗ NO
<p>MOBILITY AIDS Battery-powered wheelchairs or other similar mobility devices with lithium ion batteries where the battery is specifically designed to be removed, the battery must be carried in the cabin.</p>	✗ NO	✓ YES
<p>NON-RADIOACTIVE MEDICINAL OR TOILETRY ARTICLES Non-radioactive medicinal or toiletry articles (including aerosols) such as hair sprays, perfumes, colognes and medicines containing alcohol; and Non-flammable, non-toxic (Division 2.2) aerosols, with no subsidiary hazard, for sporting or home use The total net quantity of non-radioactive medicinal or toiletry articles and non-flammable, non-toxic (Division 2.2) aerosols must not exceed 2 kg or 2 L and the net quantity of each single article must not exceed 0.5 kg or 0.5 L. Release valves on aerosols must be protected by a cap or other suitable means to prevent inadvertent release of the contents.</p>	✓ YES	✓ YES
<p>OXYGEN OR AIR, GASEOUS, CYLINDERS Required for medical use. The cylinder must not exceed 5 kg gross weight.</p> <p>NOTE: Liquid oxygen systems are forbidden for transport.</p>	✓ YES	✓ YES

SECURITY- TYPE ATTACHÉ CASES, CASH BOXES, CASH BAGS, ETC. Incorporating dangerous goods, such as lithium batteries and/or pyrotechnic material, except as provided in 2.3.2.6 are totally forbidden. See entry in 4.2–List of Dangerous Goods.	✗ FORBIDDEN	
SPECIMEN, NON-INFECTUOS Packed with small quantities of flammable liquid, must meet A180 .	✓ YES	✗ NO

It is strictly prohibited to take on board or check in any other dangerous goods not mentioned on the list. Neither is it permitted to exceed the maximum quantities indicated in our dangerous goods guide.
